Mayor and Council Regular Meeting - November 28, 2023

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of North Caldwell was held on Tuesday, November 28, 2023. The meeting began at 6:32p.m. at Borough Hall and was held simultaneously via tele/video-conference.

Mayor Raymond called the meeting to order announcing that notice was provided in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 231, P.L. 1975. He provided a statement regarding the conduct of the teleconference which would allow members of the public to participate and be heard during public comment.

Roll Call indicated the following:

Also present were: Glenn Domenick, Borough Administrator; Jarrid Kantor, Borough Counsel; Karl Strodthoff, Police Chief; and Tami Michelotti, Borough Clerk.

Mayor Raymond asked members of the Recreation Soccer Championship teams to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Mayor's Report

Mayor Raymond provided an update on the community pool improvements. He stated that the Planning Board reviewed the Senior Inclusionary Residential Overlay (SIRO) zoning ordinance and found it to be consistent with the Master Plan. He congratulated the North Caldwell Police Department on receiving a AAA Traffic Safety awards. Mayor Raymond congratulated Council President Floria-Callori, Councilman Atlas and Councilman Tilton on their re-elections. He thanked all who participated in the Veteran's Day commemoration and in the Diwali event hosted by the North Caldwell Multicultural Society. Mayor Raymond announced the Joy, Peace and Goodwill event scheduled for December 3, the ongoing Annual Toy Drive, the North Caldwell Fire Department's "Best Appearance Award" at the annual holiday parade in Totowa, the West Essex High School State Championship participation by the football team and victories by the marching band and field hockey team. He welcomed residents to visit the holiday display at Turtle Back Zoo and wished everyone a Happy Hanukah.

### **Recreation Soccer Championship Recognition**

Mayor Raymond and the Borough Council welcomed championship teams from the North Caldwell Recreation Soccer program and presented certificates to the players and coaches.

# <u>Citizens to be Heard</u> – Agenda Items Only

On a motion by Councilman Weinstein, seconded by Councilman Kessler, public comment was opened.

Tom Fink, 2 Skyline Drive – Mr. Fink requested that ambiguity in the proposed Tree Ordinance be clarified including the requirement for tree contractors to endorse tree removal plans, certification of hazardous trees prior to removal, and registration of tree contractors. Council President Floria-Callori reviewed the most recent revisions and the intention of the contractor registration requirement.

Elliott Sommer, 143 Four Seasons Drive – Mr. Sommer requested replanting of trees removed during the construction of The Reserve at North Caldwell development. He stated that the Four Seasons community is affected with drainage and erosion issues for which a significant cost will be incurred to correct the problems.

Nihir Jariwala, 4 Arbor Road – Mr. Jariwala requested information on the TMobile escrow resolutions on the agenda. Mr. Domenick explained the intention for the escrows to pay for VComm's consulting services for the cellular tower installation project. Mr. Jariwala requested that alternative solutions to the towers be considered.

# <u>Citizens to be Heard</u> – Any subject matter

Tom Fink, 2 Skyline Drive – Mr. Fink asked if alternative locations were identified for installation of the cell towers. He noted his concern for the tower height and potential fall zones.

Nicholas Simonetti, 37 Beachmont Terrace – Mr. Simonetti, eighth-grade student at West Essex Middle School, requested a bike lane be designated on Mountain Avenue between East Greenbrook Road and Smull Avenue to facilitate safe access between the north and south sides of town by bicycle. Chief Strodthoff noted that Mountain Avenue is a county road, and suggested that the Borough Engineer identify feasible options for a bike lane for Essex County to review.

Estella and Stuart Mendelson, 13 Oxford Road – Mr. Mendelson requested permission from the Mayor and Council for an exception to the stormwater regulations requiring drywells as a solution to his increase in impervious coverage to expand his pool deck. He suggested that the stormwater drainage be fed into the existing drainage easements instead of held in a retention structure. Mr. Domenick would review the permit application with the Borough Engineer and follow up with the Mendelsons.

John Noto, 38 Deer Trail Road – Mr. Noto requested revision of the Borough's noise ordinance to prevent landscaping noise from interrupting residents who work and school at home. He suggested requiring battery-powered equipment or limiting the permitted hours of operation.

### **Council Commentary**

Councilman Kessler requested submissions for the fourth quarter Community Newsletter by December 12, 2023.

Councilman Weinstein welcomed Borough Administrator Glenn Domenick and thanked him his timely accomplishments since his appointment. Councilman Rees thanked Ms. Michelotti for her efforts during the transition between administrators.

# **Executive Session**
